## Fraunces Tavern® Museum Independent Visit Social Narrative

I am going to visit Fraunces Tavern Museum. At the Museum, I will learn about the Revolutionary War and life in the 1700s.



The Museum's entrance is at 54 Pearl Street. The Fraunces Tavern Restaurant also uses this entrance. To visit the Museum, I will walk past the restaurant's host stand and go up the stairs. The restaurant can be crowded, so I may have to wait for people to move so I can pass them.





When I go up the stairs, I will pay admission to enter the Museum. Sometimes there is a line at the admissions desk. I may have to wait a few minutes to pay admission.





I can visit the Long Room. This room has artifacts from the 1700s. It is the site of George Washington's farewell to his officers at the end of the Revolutionary War.



I can also visit six other rooms with exhibitions about the Revolutionary War, George Washington, and the history of the Museum's building. These are pictures of some of the exhibitions I can visit.








On certain days, I can take a guided tour of the Museum. These tours are usually on Fridays, Saturdays, or Sundays. I can check the <u>Museum's website to see if a tour is scheduled</u> for the day of my visit or ask a Museum employee when I arrive.



If I need to use the bathroom, I can find it on the third floor in the Mesick Gallery. If I have trouble finding the bathroom, I can return to the admission desk and ask a Museum employee for directions.



When it is time to leave, I will go back the way I came in. The Museum's exit is the same as the entrance. Before I leave, I can visit the gift shop if I want to purchase a souvenir from the Museum.
