Fraunces Tavern [®] Museum to honor Joyce Lee Malcolm as 2019 Book Award winner at Battles of Lexington and Concord Dinner (including Fraunces Tavern Museum Book Award Presentation)

New York: On April 22, Sons of the Revolution[™] in the State of New York, Inc. will host their annual Lexington and Concord Dinner (including Fraunces Tavern Museum Book Award Presentation), where they will honor this year's winner, historian and constitutional scholar Joyce Lee Malcolm for *The Tragedy of Benedict Arnold: An American Life*. An Honorable Mention will also be awarded to reporter and Pulitzer Prize nominee Bob Drury and writer Tom Clavin for their book *Valley Forge*, and to author Albert Louis Zambone for *Daniel Morgan: A Revolutionary Life*.

Since 1972 the Fraunces Tavern Museum Book Award has been presented annually to the best author of a newly published work on the American Revolutionary War that combines original scholarship, insight, and good writing. "Choosing a winner for the Book Award is no easy task, since each year the Museum receives dozens of submissions of fascinating, newly published works." says **Education & Public Programs Coordinator, Sarah Kneeshaw**. "The committee looks for a book that is a compelling read for both scholars and history enthusiasts. We are pleased to present the 2019 Book Award to Joyce Lee Malcolm, whose book *The Tragedy of Benedict Arnold: An American Life* has succeeded in presenting a fresh, nuanced look at an often misunderstood figure of the American Revolution."

The Fraunces Tavern Museum Book Award is one way the Museum fulfills its mission to educate the public about the Revolution and acknowledge the historical community dedicated to the study and public education regarding the American fight for freedom.
